God's Big Story

The more deeply we are cast under a story's spell, the more potent its influence.

A Challenge Before Us - The Changing Landscape

- We are in an era of change and transition
 - We were in a time of loss of participation in religious institutions
 - Our solution: increase our reach by providing resources to people reach eventually exhausts us; reach is an escalating game and competition game
 - Note: People leave when we don't provide the resources they want for the life they are pursuing for themselves or for their children (contrast: lifelong members)
 - We are moving into a time of an absence of belief; God no longer is part of life
 - Our Direction:
 - Find ways to enliven belief, to connect people to the Sacred
 - From resources to telling and living a better story; inviting people into the story, success
 - Reject idea that people are resources to increase our reach, instead they are people who walk with us through life
 - Embrace being out of control we can't control the outcomes, what we can do is create context
 - Putting together emotion (hearts stirred) and affection (moving toward others in love)
